Examination Procedure Notes:

- The technical section of the exam shall be terminated as failed if at any stage the number of errors becomes greater than 6
- The technical section of the exam may be terminated as successful at any point after the break point at the discretion of the examiners if total errors are less than or equal to the number in brackets on the line of the technique being tested.
- On completion of the whole technical section of the exam, if there are less than 7 errors the technical section has been passed.**
- The technical section of the exam tests a balance of tachi-waza and ne-waza techniques and a balance of 2 Kyu techniques and techniques from lower grade syllabi. These balances exist both before and after the break point in the technical exam. To maintain these balances, techniques must be processed in the order given on the exam sheet.
- Graders may at their discretion determine how the techniques shall be demonstrated. This may include such things as uchi-komi, ido-uchi-komi, nage-komi, kaeshi-waza, renraku-waza and escapes where appropriate. There is no obligation to test all formats or a specific number of formats.
- People react in different ways to being under pressure so it is left to the grader's discretion as to how they interact with the examinees through out the exam. This may include such things as enhanced explanations of what is being required of the examinee. However, graders are expected to bear in mind that this is a test of both the examinee's theoretical knowledge and practical competency. Allowing techniques demonstrated as a result of copying what others are doing or detailed instruction on the part of graders or other parties during the exam is not considered a valid method of examination.
